ishop Fintan Gavin has recently issued a Pastoral Letter Dto the people and priests of the Diocese of Cork and Ross a summary of which will be available at weekend Masses in all parishes on weekend of 27th/28th August next. In this Pastoral Letter he outlines the rationale for the reconfiguration of parishes into families of parishes working together, sharing resources and with teams of priests working across the parishes in each family of parishes.

12 families of parishes will be established this September and a further four will be established in 2023. Blackrock and Mahon parishes will join a family of parishes with Ballinlough and Blackrock Road in 2023 so we have another year to plan and prepare for this.

As part of phase one of this reconfiguration in the Diocese, Bishop Fintan announced a series of new diocesan appointments. While Blackrock and Mahon parishes will join a family of parishes next year, the announcement of diocesan appointments included two milestone ones for our parishes of Blackrock and Mahon. Canon Tadhg Ó Mathúna will retire after 22 years of diligent priestly ministry in Blackrock. Fr. J.P. O'Riordan CSsR will return to the Redemptorists in Limerick after 11 years of dedicated ministry in Mahon Parish. We are profoundly grateful to Canon Tadhq and Fr. J.P. for their dedicated priestly witness and hard work over many years.

These changes will have an impact on our parishes. Fr. Colin and Fr. Michael will endeavour to maintain the current schedule of weekend Masses in both parishes. However, in consultation with the parish councils in Blackrock and Mahon, we will need to adjust the weekday Mass schedule to take into account that only one priest will be available on weekdays from early September.

These meetings will take place soon with a view to having a plan in place for weekday Masses in September.


