Some thoughts on today's scripture.....

We celebrate the most passionate and enduring of all human relationships, that of mother and child. As Mary looked at her baby, and gave him her breast, she knew that there was a dimension here beyond her guessing. Christians thought about it for four centuries before they dared to consecrate the title Mother of God. Like Mary, we treasure the words spoken about Jesus, and ponder them in our hearts.

Every birth is a precious gift of God of someone new in the world; we brought a new joy and promise to parents and to the world on our birth. This would be more so in Jesus – the one who saves is the meaning of his name. The world would never be the same because of him, and maybe Mary began to know that when the shepherds came and told her their story.

A new year is like a new birth: something can become alive in us that life is always new, grace flows new each day and in every moment. In the dawn of New Year's Day God is visiting us 'like the dawn from on high'. Offer in prayer your hopes for this coming year – hopes for yourself, hopes for others.

God's messengers tell the shepherds something astonishing, that a baby boy lying in a manger is both Messiah and Lord, God and Saviour! They, in their turn, repeat the angels' extraordinary message to Mary and Joseph. As Jesus grew and developed, Mary must have pondered all these things as she laced his sandals, prepared his meals, soothed him when he cried and watched over him as he learned how to use carpenter's tools. Like any mother, she must have pondered what the future had in store for her son.

We too are called to ponder Jesus' life so that his ways of thinking and his value system may become ours.

Observations

Very best wishes for the feast of Mary, Mother of the Church. This is a relatively new feast, replacing the feast of the Circumcision. There is something of a loss because the Circumcision is a reminder of our Jewish roots. The blessing of Aaron makes a very suitable first reading.



The icon of Mary, SALUS POPULI ROMANI (the health of the people of Rome), is said to have arrived in Rome in AD 590. The abbreviated letters in Greek at the top identify Mary as "Mother of God" (MHTHP ØEOY).

The image type itself suggests an Early

Christian concept dating from antiquity: a majestic, half-length portrait showing a frank outward gaze of the ruler-like Virgin, with her upright, stately pose and folded hands gently clasping the Child, unique among all icons.
