Observations

#### **NAMES**

In Matthew 1-2, the baby is given no fewer than three names: Jesus, Emmanuel, the Nazarene. Each bears a meaning and is significant. As Matthew is careful to explain, "Jesus" means "YHWH saves" and is the equivalent of the Hebrew name Joshua. Emmanuel is likewise explained as "God-withus", echoed in the very last verse of this Gospel, framing the whole Gospel. The spelling in Matthew 2:23 is literally nazōraios or Nazorean, the name given derisively to the early followers of Jesus. In this oblique way, Matthew indicates that the destiny of the disciples cannot be different to that of the master. Nevertheless, the same Jesus is with us always to the end of the age.

### A good Advent?

We find ourselves right in the middle of Advent, which this year takes the four full weeks. What is a "good" Advent? Bishop Sarah Mulally — CofE bishop of London — offers this reflection: If we want to be people of hope, we need to be people who encounter God, who turn aside from our path and look and wait. Then we will have sight to see and will be formed into people of hope. Hope, as the author of Hebrews reminds us (6.19), is an anchor for the soul, firm and secure. # Thought for the day

In a culture where God is, apparently, absent, it may sound strange to hear words such as "Do not be afraid" and "God is with us." Such assurances are at the heart our biblical faith from start to finish. Everyone who is anyone in the Bible is told not to be afraid. And the assurance "I will be with you" is found throughout starting with the very name of God in Ex 3:14, I am who I am. The God-in whom we live and move and have our being—is there allalong, whether we are aware of it or not. Faith is the moment of discovery and recognition.

You are with us always: you are with us in creation in all its splendour, inour fellow human beings in all their generosity, you are with us in the quiet where we are alone with you. Amen. K O'Mahony OSA

As we move into prayer on the passage, we move from consideration of the mystery of how "God with us" was revealed to the world in the person of Jesus two thousand years ago, to a reflection on how we become aware of "God with us" now in our daily lives.

- 1. It took some time for Joseph to accept the fact that in Mary there truly was Emmanuel-God with us. God is with us now, but at times we struggle to perceive God's presence. Where have you unexpectedly discovered the presence of "God with you"? Recall those experiences and give thanks.
- 2. Joseph was confused and uncertain about what he should do. It was difficult for him to discern what his next step should be. Perhaps you have also had to make difficult journeys on the way to some decisions or commitments. Recall that journey and the moments when it became clear to you what was being asked of you. Give thanks for the angels who helped you along the way.
- 3. Mary bore Jesus within her, unseen to all, and unacknowledged by most. In Joseph she found one who believed in the treasure that she bore. We can be bearers of Jesus to others, and they to us. When have you been a bearer of Jesus to another? Who has been that to you?
- 4. The experience of having a gift that others do not see or recognise can be painful and isolating. Then someone comes, like Joseph to Mary, who gets to believe in what we have to offer. Has that happened to you? What was it like?

#### **PRAYER**

Eternal God, in the psalms of David, in the words of the prophets, in the dream of Joseph, your promise is spoken. At last, in the womb of the Virgin Mary, your Word takes flesh. Teach us to welcome Jesus, the promised Emmanuel, and to preach the good news of his coming that every age may know him as the source of redemption and grace. We ask this through him whose coming is certain, whose day draws near: your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever. Amen.
