

Some thoughts on today's Gospel.....

The apostles saw into the real Jesus - a few hours on the mountains which they would never forget. When later they would see the disfigured face and the dying body on the cross, Peter and James and John would remember this day, and would remember it for the rest of their lives. They saw Jesus as the Son of God, and saw a glimpse in him of our humanity at its best. The glory of Jesus is the glory of love - his love unto death, and the love in him of Father and Spirit.

From Working Document -

19. Some follow Jesus more explicitly, experiencing the fidelity of discipleship, while others are invited to return to their ordinary lives: yet all testify to the power of the faith that has saved them (cf. Mt 15:28). Among those who follow Jesus, the figure of the apostles, whom he himself calls from the beginning, having given them the task of mediating authoritatively the crowd's relationship with Revelation and with the coming of God's Kingdom, clearly becomes prominent. The third actor's entrance on the scene occurs not thanks to a cure or a conversion, but because it coincides with Jesus' call. The election of the apostles is not the privilege of an exclusive position of power and separation but the grace of an inclusive ministry of blessing and fellowship. Thanks to the gift of the Spirit of the Risen Lord, they are to guard the place of Jesus, without replacing him: not to put filters on his presence, but to make it easy to encounter him.

20. Jesus, the crowd in its diversity, the apostles: this is the imagery and the mystery that must be constantly contemplated and explored in depth so that the Church may increasingly become what she is. None of the three actors can leave the scene. If Jesus is absent, and someone else takes his place, the Church then becomes a contract between the apostles and the crowd and whose dialogue will end up following the plot of the political game. Without the apostles, authorized by Jesus and instructed by the Spirit, the relationship with the evangelical truth is broken, and the crowd, whether it accepts or rejects Jesus, remains exposed to a myth or an ideology about him. Without the crowd, the apostles' relationship with Jesus becomes corrupted into a sectarian and self-referential form of religion, and evangelization, which emanates from the direct self-revelation that God addresses personally to all, offering His salvation, loses its light.







Inspiration

The event of the Transfiguration remains fundamentally shrouded in mystery as such. But the manner of the telling orients us through symbolism: a mountain, light bright as the sun, a bright cloud, a voice, fear and the reassurance not to be afraid. Even the desire to hold on to the experience is part of it: if you wish, I will make three tents here. The disclosure of who Jesus really was leads to an instruction which transcends the particularity of the event: 'This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to him.'

pecial moments of "presence" are important to us, even though we may not often speak of them. These can happen in all sort of ways: at the birth of a child, in nature, while listening to music, in prayer, as we contemplate a work of art and so forth. In any case, always unexpectedly. Often we would be a little embarrassed to talk about such "epiphanies" for fear of seeming foolish or naive but, nevertheless, such intimations of something more really matter to us personally because they give the holy a foothold in our own experience. We would like to prolong such experiences, but that is not their nature (as Peter discovered!).

Help us, Lord, to recognise you more and more in the present moment of our lives, that our love for you may be real and our hope in you strong. K O'Mahony OSA

- 1. The transfiguration experience was one that, for Jesus, clarified his relation- ship with his Father and strengthened him for the future. What have been the experiences, the moments of insight, that have clarified your sense of who you are, and what is your relationship with God?
- 2. On the mountain the disciples saw Jesus in a new way. Sometimes in friend- ship there are moments of sharing in which we get to know a friend in a new and deeper way. Have you had that ex- perience in human friendship, or in your relationship with Jesus and God. Recall when that happened, and what it was like for you.
- 3. The clear vision of Jesus with Moses and Elijah was followed by a frightening experience of being in a cloud and it was in the midst of the cloud that the disciples were instructed "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him". Have you had the experience of learning the truth about life and about your relation- ship with God from moments of confu- sion as well as from times of special joy?
- 4. After their special experience the dis-ciples came down the mountain again. We cannot live each day at the level of special spiritual experiences, but the memory of them can strengthen us in difficult times. What memories encour- age vou in time of trouble?
