Come and See

ur gospel text at Mass this weekend is more notable for what it doesn't say rather than what is included. This is often the case and is the reason why we need to



take time to listen carefully rather than rushing to apply it.

The simple words of Jesus are to 'come and see'. There is no long discussion, the enquirers are not referred on. Nowadays, they might be referred to a website somewhere! They are simply invited by Jesus to spend time in his presence in the Eucharist, as we do each weekend, or in prayer at home or in the church.

We have a beautiful parish church and many people drop in to pray. People often say that they get great peace and comfort being in the church in prayer and with their own thoughts.

The invitation is always to 'come and see'. It's also the invitation to people who would like to be at Mass but for many reasons have fallen out of the habit. The best words are the three words of Jesus in our gospel this weekend to 'come and see'.

May God bless us all as we enter a new year in hope and faith. St. Michael, pray for us.

A brief introduction on today's readings First reading 1 Samuel 3:3-10,19

When God tries to get through to us, sometimes we are not ready, deaf in some way. This experience is reassuringly mirrored in today's story in which the young Samuel needs help to recognise that it is God who is calling him.

Second reading 1 Corinthians 6:13-15,17-20

Corinth in the time of St Paul may see a long way away from twenty-first century reality. Human nature is, nevertheless, the same and the same issues that come up now came up then: how to bring together my Christian values and my everyday life? In this particular example, notice the reasons given—are they still valid for us today?

Gospel John 1:35-42

Today's gospel challenges us with a simple phrase: "come and see." How did the first disciples get to know Jesus? How do we get to know him today?
