Tips for keeping cool in hot weather

When inside you should:

- turn off lights and appliances not in use as they generate heat
- close windows that face the sun during the day, and open them at night when the temperature drops
- close curtains in rooms that get morning or afternoon sun
- sprinkle water over your skin, or keep a damp cloth on the back of your neck
- use an electric fan (but only if the temperature is below 35 dearees)
- When outside you should:
- avoid going out during the hottest part of the day if possible (11am to 3pm)
- wear light and loose-fitting clothing that covers your skin
- wear a wide brimmed hat and sunglasses
- regularly apply a broad-spectrum (UVA and UVB) waterresistant sunscreen to skin that is not covered, using factor 30+ for adults and 50+ for children
- stay in the shade
 - Drink plenty of fluids
- Adults need about 2 litres of water over 24 hours (may be less for smaller people or those with medical conditions) **HSE GUIDELINES**
