

Recently Deceased George Wallace, Mahon Rest in Peace



When I was student for the priesthood, I clearly recall returning home from Maynooth at this time of the year. In those days, we would have returned to Maynooth in late August and the first visit home was at the end of October.



I couldn't but notice the change between late August and late October. The familiar trees that surrounded our farmvard and home were nearly empty of leaves, temperatures had changed, the summer warmth and colours had gone. Evenings were darker and I had not been part of this natural change of season and scenery while in college. The difference was stark.

We begin our Novena for the Dead this Sunday. We will place their names on our Novena Lists, pray for them at Mass and know that we are closest to them gathered around the Altar. We remember our beloved dead, in love. As we know from personal experience, those who have gone from us have not ceased to be part of our lives. On the contrary, they can be even more intensely part of who we are, more intensely present to us. There is more to this than the psychology of loss. As people of faith, we entrust our beloved dead to the living God, from whom we all came, because to him all are alive. I like very much a sentiment of Edward Schillebeecks OP, in a prayer for the dead:

Father, we cannot believe all they have meant to us is lost forever. You are their life, now and always.

Reflections

- 1. True compassion of one person for another can change a situation. When has the capacity of another person to empathise with you, and feel with you in a situation, made a difference? When has your compassion been a source of comfort and strength to another?
- 2. After Jesus had visited their town the people in Nain thought: "God has visited his people." Bring to mind encounters you have had, or events you have attended, that left you with a greater than usual sense of the presence of God in that experience.
- 3. The miracle is a reminder to us of our belief that Christ has conquered death and because of that our mortal death is not the end. How does this belief affect your attitude towards your own mortality, and to the deaths of significant people in your life?

Prayer

O God, our very breath, our only hope, in every age you take pity on us and bring forth life from death.

Visit your people and raise your Church to new life, that we may join with all generations in voicing our wonder and praise. We make our prayer through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.


Lord, for your faithful people life is changed, not ended. When the body of our earthly dwelling lies in death, we gain an everlasting dwelling place in heaven. Amen.
