A brief introduction on Sunday's readings

First reading Isaiah 58:7-10

It is easy to fall into the trap of thinking that once we have said our prayers and been to church, we've done our bit. Isaiah puts us straight.

Second reading 1 Corinthians 2:1-5

What is the foundation of our faith? Not the wonderful persuasive oratory of anyone, even St Paul himself! What then? Our very own experience of the power of God and his Holy Spirit in our lives. We may need to reclaim this today for ourselves.

Gospel Matthew 5:13-16

We are used to thinking of Jesus as the light of the world — but so are we! The question is: how do we ourselves bear this light today and give witness to our faith?

The Good News and being salt and light

The good news, the Gospel, is rich. Perhaps these few steps may help: itis the discovery that God is love — that kind of spontaneous, totally natural and unthinking love of a father or mother for a new-born child. That might be hard to feel or even to be convinced of, but that is how it is. We believe this extraordinary love has been disclosed in Jesus — in his teaching, his actions, his person, his death and resurrection. It leads to a profound sense of joy in believing — a conviction that life is a great adventure, worth living to the full and, importantly, that nothing is ever lost. In other words, evangelisation is predicated upon the full Christian proclamation, in all its arresting richness.

Once we do take the step to personal faith, or, in the words of St Paul, once we allow ourselves to be overwhelmed by the love of God, it is no longer really possible to keep the good news, the euangelion, to ourselves. It is so good, it has to be shared.

Reflections

1. Jesus uses the image of salt as something that makes food tasty. Without it food can be tasteless. Who are the people who give zest to your life and make it enjoyable? For whom have you done this? When have you been particularly aware of your potential in this regard?

2. The second image is that of light. Who have been the people who have been a light for you, particularly in moments of darkness? For whom have you been a light? Recall these experiences and give thanks.

3. The images of salt and light can also be applied to communities to which we belong, a family, a parish, or other group. Thinking of the groups of which you are a member, how can the potential be enhanced to enrich the lives of members and offer them a guiding light?

PRAYER

Heavenly Father, you have called your church to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world. Give us vigorous faith and a love that is genuine, so that all may see our works and give you the glory. We make our prayer through Christ, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever. Amen.
